



How to Prepare for a Flea Treatment

1. Clean & Vacuum Thoroughly

- Vacuum all floors, carpets, rugs, baseboards, and upholstered furniture.
- Pay extra attention to:
- Under furniture
- Along walls
- Pet resting areas
- **Immediately dispose of vacuum contents** outside (fleas + eggs can survive).

2. Wash Fabrics

- Wash all pet bedding, throws, blankets, linens, small rugs, etc.
- Use **hot water & high heat drying** to kill fleas and eggs.

3. Prepare Your Pets

- Treat each pet with an approved flea product – oral products recommended
- Remove pets from treatment area.
- Wash or replace collars, harnesses, and soft toys.

4. Declutter the Home

- Pick up items off the floor so treatment reaches more surfaces.
- Store children's toys and loose items in sealed containers.

5. Prepare for Professional Treatment

Before techs arrive:

- Unplug items if asked.
- Cover or remove fish tanks and turn off pumps.
- Everyone (including pets) must leave during application and stay out until the area is dry (2 to 4 hours).

What NOT To Do Before Treatment

Do **not** steam clean before treatment. It reduces product effectiveness.

After Treatment Tips

- You may still see fleas for 7–14 days (new ones hatching) – Follow up visit will be scheduled to treat and determine if additional follow up visits are needed.
- Vacuum daily to remove newly hatched fleas
- Continue pet flea preventatives
